Winter Social Bowls – Alan Harris

Winter Wednesday and Saturday social bowls is up and running and off to a fantastic start. The weather has been favourable with between 40-60 players supporting the days. The 12.30pm prompt start ensures the games are completed around 4.00pm and players beat the cold evening breeze that sets in on a regular basis.

Many new players are joining and of course are at different stages of their progress. I am confident all of them will play an important role in our Pennant teams this coming season.

There is no question this is the time of the year to start bowling. Help and coaching is available at no charge and new players have several months to develop style and technique before the Pennant season starts. So if you have friends or family interested in bowls now is the time to start.

Our greenkeeper Nigel Ryan with David Sutherland are doing a great job providing the bowlers with fantastic greens which are a delight to play on. In addition Nigel through his company D & D Curators is sponsoring the Wednesday and Saturday social bowls.
